Attendance at School

All the research shows that children who attend school regularly do better at school!

This is not surprising, as it is through the discussions with the teacher and the interactions in the classroom, directed at the work presented by the teacher that leads to a deepening understanding of the skills and contents of subject. Most of our students have an excellent record of attendance and are to be congratulated on this! A few however, have developed some poor attendance patterns and it adversely affecting their academic is achievement. Your child needs to be at school every day that the school is open. This applies to students from Year 7 to Year 12, including those who are over 17 years old. For students in Years 10, 11 and 12 in particular, continued absence from school results in a determination of Non-completion of course requirements for the RoSA, Preliminary or HSC course. If the child is over 17 years of age, then they can be expelled for lack of participation in schooling.

What happens if my child has poor attendance?

If a child's rate of attendance is below 85%, then the school will request a meeting to discuss plans to ensure improved attendance. If this is not successful, then a referral to the Home School Liaison Officer will be submitted for students who are under 17 years of age. Where a child is over 17 years of age, the Principal will request a meeting with the parent and student to form a plan to improve attendance. If there is no improvement, then the student may be expelled for lack of participation in schooling. Achieving a good result at school is important for your son or daughter's future. Good attendance at school is a habit! Children should be in the habit of coming every day. Thank you for your support with this important area!
