SRC Report

The Student Representative Council has been involved in the organisation of a number of school-based events this term. These have included a fund raising Ice-cream sale, which aims to raise funds to purchase outdoor furniture for the Senior Quad. Other activities have also included preparing for Remembrance Day, White Ribbon Day and Footy Colour Day.

Remembrance Day marks the 100th anniversary of the Armistice which ended the First World War (1914–18). Each year, on this day, Australians observe one minute's silence at 11 am, in memory of those who have died or suffered in all wars and armed conflicts. On November the 11th, our school captains Sean, Annabelle, Ameysha and Jacob participated in the Remembrance Day commemoration, which was held at Windsor's McQuade Park. Sean and Annabelle laid a wreath as a part of Windsor High School's involvement in this event, while Ameysha had the honour of reading the poem "We Shall Keep the Faith" to the large audience in attendance.

Currently, the SRC is in the process of assisting in the preparation of White Ribbon Day, which will be held at the school on Friday 23rd of November. White Ribbon Day is an international event that raises awareness about violence against women, while aiming to educate people with the knowledge and skills to be able to keep themselves safe. During this event, the SRC will have an ice-cream stall selling a variety of flavoured ice-creams and spider drinks. All proceeds will go towards the purchase of outdoor seats for the Senior Quad.



Recently a number of Year 8 and 9 Visual Art students participated in the Hawkesbury Courier 'Design an Ad' competition. They were assigned a business to advertise, and a list of necessary information to be included in the advertisement. It is then up to their individual creativity to decide on the images, the fonts and how they are combined to make an eye-catching, colourful and appealing advertisement. This teaches students the 'real-world' skills of design and layout, working to a time-frame and to a client's set criteria, much like an advertising agency does.

The proposals are submitted to the business owners who then choose their preferred design. A final panel of judges then choose the overall winners from all the preferred designs in the region. In the High School section we are pleased to announce that Dominic Dimacuha of Year 9 was awarded Third place, a position Clarice Suela also achieved last year. He was awarded \$100 for his fine draughtsmanship showing aspects of the clients design brief.

Apart from the winners, a selection of outstanding designs were published in a special wrap-around cover of the Courier on Thursday November 8. (Check your front lawn!) We are pleased to announce that the design by McKeeley Whitmore of Year 8 was included. Once again, her images and text embodied the client's "product", gaining her the recognition she deserves as a designer.
