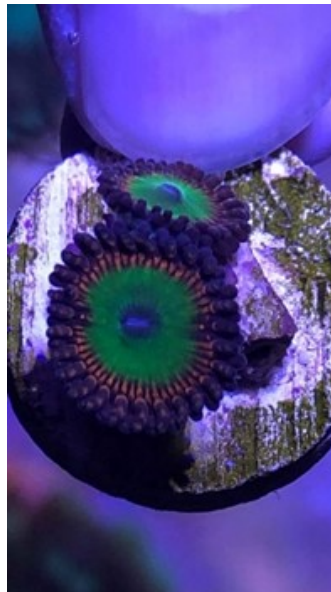

With the on-going bush fires, high temperatures and bush-fire smoke, we are ensuring all students are safe. Having every classroom air-conditioned means both students and staff are not affected by either the temperature or the air quality during class times. Days when the conditions outside are adverse, we open up the gym and the library in break times, and do not allow students to be running around on the ovals. Sport lessons are moved into the gym, hall and dance studio or classrooms to ensure students are not put at any risk.

School closures, due to extreme conditions, are controlled by the Department of Education, based on information provided to them by the Rural Fire Service and the Bureau of Meteorology. It may be the case that the decision for the next day's closure is not made until after school has finished for the day. We will communicate to our parents and carers in a variety of methods to ensure everyone knows what the Windsor High School plans are for the day. We will make announcements on the school's Facebook page, we will send an SMS to the preferred mobile contact number, we will send an email to the email address provided to the school- which is often given on the enrolment form, and we will put the communication on the School's Web page. Please make sure all your contact details are current so that you are kept up to date with what is happening at the school.

We currently have 4 teachers who are members of the Rural Fire Service and are currently fighting fires or supporting those who are. Thank you to Mr Hawes, Ms Thompson, Mrs Brown and Mr Litchfield for keeping us all safe. Let's hope the fires stop soon,
