We have two Transition Days where year 6 students try taster lessons and learn where facilities are within the school. We then have an Orientation Day where they get to meet new friends from other schools as well as further develop their knowledge of where everything is. We pair up the incoming Year 6 students with students currently in Year 9 so that on the Orientation Day they will have a reliable person who can answer all their questions. These same students then continue to meet regularly with the same students when they are in Year 7 to continue that support. Across year friendships develop which further provides ongoing support as well as further leadership opportunities for the older students. Our 2020 Peer Support Leaders are in the middle of their 2 day training workshop, getting ready to assist Year 7 with their transition to high school and in Home Group classes next year.
