As we complete the last few days of Term 3, it is important to take a few minutes to reflect on the term we have had. It has been full of challenges for students, families, and staff, but we have all done our best to support remote teaching and learning and should feel proud of what we have achieved. I have sent an email to all parents and carers updating potential plans for Term 4. The key message is we are not sure what the arrangements will be, because it is dependent on many factors including state vaccination rates, number of local cases, health guidelines and our capacity to meet the requirements at the time of return for students. At this point in time, what we know for sure is we will continue remote teaching and learning in Term 4 for all our students for the first three weeks of term. Teachers have been working hard to create class work, both online and in booklets, ready for the beginning of term. Booklets with work for weeks one to three of Term 4 will be ready to be picked on Tuesday 5th October from 8am till 4pm. We have had reports that some of our students are not staying at home and spending time out in the community. There are many COVID cases in our local area, and we are saddened to hear some of our students have contracted the virus. Please ensure all students stay at home, that families and friends are not meeting up, and when out for legitimate reasons, all are wearing masks and keeping socially distant. Please also investigate vaccination for your family as children now over the age of 12 years can be vaccinated.





Well done to all entrants so far!






Our SSO Jess has been adding some positive chalk vibes near her house. Let's see yours!

Australia Reads is on next week. This is a great opportunity for students to connect with Australian authors and continue to foster a love of




reading. We have already secured your spot at the 'Stories that Matter for teens' events, so jump onto the Library google classroom page (nokig7a) to check out all the details.

Windsor High School is again offering students the opportunity to access the printed resources from our library.


Please see following instructions on how to put in a book request.

All requests must be in by 1pm Friday 27th August to allow processing time. Pick up will be available Monday 30th August between 8.15am-4.00pm.


### How to reserve a library book.

Windsor High School uses the library management system Oliver to record all resources currently in our collection.

Oliver can be found on the Student Portal home page



Once in Oliver the home page will look like this:



Your name should appear on the right hand side of the grey bar.

From this Oliver home page you are able to search for a particular resource and browse our collection.

Once you have chosen the book you would like to borrow, click on the title.

(A green tick in front of the title means that the book is currently in the library ready for borrowing. A red cross means that it is already on loan to someone else.



Click on the Reserve button under the cover image of the book.



A pop up box will appear asking you to confirm that you wish to reserve this item. Make sure you click SAVE in this pop up box.

If the book is currently in the library, it will be prepared for you and you will receive an email letting you know when it is ready for collection. If it is not currently in the library, the reserve will stand until the book is returned by the previous borrower.
