Year 10 Food Technology turned the kitchen into a 'pizzeria' this week with some interesting taste combinations, the favourite was pepperoni and cheese.







#### **Assessments**

Year 7-10 PDHPE and PASS Term 3 assignments have been handed out recently. Students are allocated a 2 -3 week period and some class time to complete the tasks. It is imperative that students apply their best efforts to ensure they receive a mark that is reflective of their ability and submit the task punctually. If students require another copy of their task they can access it via Google Classroom as each class has their own page. In PDHPE students are assessed on their theoretical knowledge and their ability to apply the practical skills they have developed in physical education classes. Both components are equally important, providing students multiple opportunities to display their skills and understanding in PDHPE.

Students are advised to speak with a PDHPE teacher if they require further assistance.

#### **PDHPE Practical Lessons**

Practical lessons make up 50 percent of the PDHPE curriculum. In these lessons students develop and improve skills in striking, fielding, net and court sports and invasion games to name a few. Students learn some valuable life long learning skills in these classes including team work, problem solving, communication as well as the obvious health and skill related components of fitness. We encourage all students to participate to the best of their ability as we know that this is how improvements are made and new interests and hobbies are developed.

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#### **Sporting Schools**

Sports Australia continues to offer access to specialised coaching and funding for school students. The grant allows schools to choose between engaging specialist coaches or utilise teacher expertise for a 4-week program with the aim of encouraging students (particular girls) to engage and promote participation in physical activity by developing sport specific skill sets. This term we decided to use the PDHPE teachers' expertise to run the coaching sessions. This allowed the purchase of more equipment and training time for our selected 2 sports: Orienteering and Soccer. Our orienteering team entered into the Sydney West Orienteering tournament and had some pleasing results as described by Mr Litchfield in his article below. Soccer is always a favourite among the students and thanks must go to Mr Philp and Mr Cotter who run the lunch time interest group program each Thursday.


