Support Unit News

This has been a fun and busy term in our Support Unit. Our students have had new and engaging learning opportunities as well as activities tailored to their needs.

Our Year 10, 11 and 12 students have attended weekly work experience at Sunnyfield Disability Services in Mount Druitt. Students complete 90 minutes of work each Friday, wearing factory appropriate PPE. Students pack boxes and follow instructions from the supervisor carefully. All students have applied themselves diligently and have done Windsor High proud.

In our Technology Mandatory lessons with Miss Katie, Support Unit students have been making recycled paper as part of a unit on sustainability. Students have been shredding then blending used paper which they then mould and press into beautiful recycled paper. We are now beginning to use our beautiful recycled paper to make cards.



In Geography students have been studying maps and landforms related to the local environment. They have learned about human interactions with the Hawkesbury River and the Blue Mountains and created their own versions of "The Best Cruise on the Hawkesbury River".



In Creative Arts students made connections between elements of art and the senses. They created textured portraits displaying a range of emotions which allowed them to demonstrate their originality and imagination.



MC5 have been busy creating their own podcast called 'The Unsung Heroes of Windsor High School.' Students have been working outside their comfort zones and developing skills in booking interview times, interviewing staff members, and learning how to construct and edit a podcast. Throughout the process they have worked together, encouraged each other and bravely faced new challenges.

In music with Miss Sam, Support Unit students have engaged with a variety of musical instruments including acoustic guitars, percussion instruments, drums and keyboards. Students have enjoyed the opportunities to play and learn about these instruments. They also enjoyed getting to listen to Miss Sam's record player.













In PDHPE, MC4 have been extending their skills in a variety of sports including soccer, table tennis, French cricket and basketball in their practical lessons. Students are also exploring interpersonal relationship skills and developing their emotional regulation skills when dealing with conflict.



In PDHPE MC2 have been working on their fitness and learning about safe exercising practices.





In Visual Arts, MC3 & MC4 have been exploring the Mosaic artform. We have looked at some examples from around the world and explored the methods through making our own mosaics, both with paper and digitally through Google Drawings.
