At assembly, students were reminded that they should be attending all classes for the full duration. Time out cards are given to students as there are times where they are dealing with complex issues or managing their levels of anxiety. The time out is usually a 5 minute duration in the Front Office, used to assist in resetting our students for success. If a student requires a time out pass, they need to discuss this with their Year Advisor, Deputy Principal or one of our School Counsellors.

Phones and AirPods continue to be a concern inside and outside of the classroom. We are firm with our policy and a number of students have had these items confiscated throughout the week. We have also asked students to be mindful of where they place their important items because we have had a few students lose phones and Airpods recently. As part of our Phone Policy, students have been reminded that they should never take photographs or film other students due to privacy issues. It is also an offence for students to upload any of this content to social media platforms.



We are excited to announce our school will be transitioning to an upgraded School Bytes finance system on 7 March 2023!

In preparation for the transition to a simplified finance system for both you and the school, we will be required to implement a short payment lockout period where we will not be able to receive any online or EFTPOS payments.

#### What this means for you

- No payments can be made online or via EFTPOS from 4pm, Wednesday 1st March 2023.
- We will advise you when payments can resume closer to the above date
- Any existing payment links that have been sent to you previously in emails can still be used after the transition and will automatically redirect to the new system
- After the transition, a School Bytes portal will be available for you to register and begin using (Link: <a href="https://portal.schoolbytes.education">https://portal.schoolbytes.education</a>)
- All previous payments made will be migrated to the new School Bytes finance system and portal

#### What is the School Bytes portal


The School Bytes portal provides flexibility for you to conveniently:


- · Make school payments online (including paying for multiple siblings at once)
- · Use a family credit to pay for an activity or school contributions
- Download a receipt for payments made
- View all historical payments in one place
- Complete and submit digital permission notes
- View the status of all permission notes
- Request a refund if required

This can be done where you want at any time: day or night.

Through the portal, you will easily be able to download a receipt once a payment has been made and have access to view all historical payments when needed. Online payments are processed in real-time and can be viewed by school staff immediately.

While our preference is for payments to be made via the portal, we will still accept payment via cash, cheque, money order and EFTPOS.







#### SCHOOL PHOTOGRAPHS Main Day – Friday 10<sup>th</sup> March Catch Up Session – Thursday 30<sup>th</sup> March

Dear Parents/Caregivers

School photographs will take place on **Friday 10<sup>th</sup> March**. Junior students are expected to wear their everyday green polo school shirt and seniors are to wear their white shirts to participate in the school photographs. All students will have their portrait taken, irrespective of whether an order will be placed.

The company ADVANCED LIFE photographers have been engaged again for this year's photographs. The information envelope has been issued with this note and the costs are outlined on the flyer located in the envelope.

It is preferred that the photo packages are ordered and paid for online BEFORE the photo day. Students are to bring their envelope and correct money on the day ONLY, if they have NOT ordered online. Students must hand the payment envelopes directly to the photographers on the day. For online payments, please go to <a href="https://www.advancedlife.com.au">www.advancedlife.com.au</a> and enter the 9 digit online ordering code found on the front of the order form.

Students that have not yet provided permission to publish their photographs to the school will **NOT** be included in their year's group photobook unless parents/carers provide written permission prior to the day to Mrs Birch.

This year, students in **ALL** year groups will be issued with a student ID card. The card will have a barcode for use within the school. All students will be photographed for the ID cards even if they do not order a photo package.

Students that wish to have a sibling photo taken MUST obtain a special sibling photo information envelope from the front office. Orders are to be completed online at <a href="https://www.advancedlife.com.au">www.advancedlife.com.au</a> and enter the 9 digit online ordering code found on the front of the sibling envelope. Online ordering for sibling photographs closes at 11:59 pm on Thursday 9th March, 2023

Students who are absent on the day will have the opportunity to have their individual photo taken on **Thursday 30<sup>th</sup> March 2023**.

Please note: Traditional, Composite or High-Resolution Virtual Group format is chosen by your school. Sibling photos, if available, can also be ordered online and must be ordered prior to your photo day. A late fee will apply for photos purchased after ordering has closed.

## how to order

#### order online

Online payment options include Visa, Mastercard and PayPal. Alternatively, you can choose to pay over 10 weeks using LatitudePay.

#### STEP 1

Go to www.advancedlife.com.au on your computer, phone or tablet.

#### STEP 2

Enter your school code:

#### DH4 RP3 BLD

in the 'order and download' box. This will take you to your school's secure online ordering site.



#### STEP 3

Click on 'Order Photos' and complete your details and procedures. During this process you can place orders for additional children at your school and sibling photos, if available







#### cash/envelope ordering

Your school prefers orders to be placed online. However, if you are unable to order online, please complete your order using the order envelope provided.

#### STEP 1

Complete a separate order envelope for each individual child's package/s ordered. If ordering for more than one child, payment should be enclosed in the envelope of the eldest child and this should be indicated on the envelope of the other child/children (the envelope that does not have cash enclosed).

#### STEP 2

Enclose exact cash payment in one envelope for the package/s you are ordering. Payment for more than one child should be in the eldest child's envelope and marked at the bottom of the envelope in the space provided.

#### STEP 3

Return your completed envelope/s, with correct cash payment, to our photographers on the day.

Please note: You must enclose exact correct payment, as change is not available. Credit card payments can only be made online and we no longer accept cheques. There is a separate envelope for sibling photo orders, should your school choose to offer sibling photos.

School photographs will be returned approximately 6 weeks after the day of photography.

Please note this delivery timeframe is dependant on proofing and additional photography days at your school.

#### IMPORTANT - "not for publication" students

If you have instructed your school that your child's image is "not for publication" (sometimes called "do not publish" or "not for media release" instructions), the school will ensure that your child is not presented to our photographers on photo day and school photographs will not be available for purchase. If you wish to change your instruction, then you must notify your school, so they change their records and identify your child as able to be photographed for school photography purposes. All students presented to our photographers by your school on photo day will be photographed, their images will appear in school photography packages with their fellow students and these packages will be available to purchase by all families.


