PDHPE Newsletter

As always, learning is the priority with the key focus on helping students develop skills to make educated health-based decisions whilst developing problem solving skills, working collaboratively and building their movement skills in physical education classes and sport.

I would like to thank the staff at Windsor High School who take on the role of coaches and trainers. They do this in addition to their teaching responsibilities, as a result our students are provided with many extracurricular opportunities. Without their dedication and time this would not be possible.

Assessments

Year 7-10 PDHPE and PASS Term 3 assignments were handed out recently. Students are allocated a 3 week period and some class time to complete the tasks. It is imperative that students apply their best efforts to ensure they receive a mark that is reflective of their ability and submit the task punctually. If students require another copy of their task they can access it via Google Classroom as each class has their own page. In PDHPE students are assessed on their theoretical knowledge and their ability to apply the practical skills they have developed in physical education classes. Both components are equally important, providing students multiple opportunities to display their skills and understanding in PDHPE.

Students are advised to speak with a PDHPE teacher if they require further assistance.

PDHPE Practical Lessons

Practical lessons make up 50 percent of the PDHPE curriculum. In these lessons students develop and improve skills in striking, fielding, net and court sports and invasion games to name a few. Students learn some valuable lifelong learning skills in these classes including teamwork, problem solving, communication as well as the obvious health and skill related components of fitness. We encourage all students to participate to the best of their ability as we know that this is how improvements are made and new interests and hobbies are developed.




Our clinicians are trained in a specialised program to help students develop their reading and spelling skills. The program also aims to improve their oral language and vocabulary skills as well.
