

Through hands-on activities like crafting shields and learning period dances, they've brought history to life in their classroom.

MC5 has been learning about Force and Friction in Science. They created a range of Science toys such as 'The Oscillating Woodpecker', 'The Climbing Man' and the 'The Balancing Bird'.

In Mathematics this term students have learnt about money and multiplication. We have completed tasks involving calculating best buys, applying discounts as a percentage and how to make the most of saving our money. Our students are all very savvy shoppers!
